- 1. **Biodata Page of Passport or Travel Document** with validity of no less than 6 months
- 2. **Photograph** taken within the last 6 months with a light -coloured background
- 3. Proof of permanent residence in Switzerland/ Liechtenstein
- 4. Financial evidence with a fixed deposit of no less than 3,000,000 THB or no less than 1,800,000 THB, together with a monthly income of no less than 1,200,000 THB per year in a Thai bank located in Thailand

(e.g., bank statements for the last 3 months, proof of earnings)

- 5. A <u>medical certificate</u> issued in the country where the application is submitted, showing no prohibitive diseases (Leprosy, Tuberculosis, Elephantiasis, drug addiction, and third stage of Syphilis) as specified in the Ministerial Regulation No. 14 (B.E. 2535). The certificate must be valid for no more than 3 months.
- 6. Foreign Insurance Certificate, as stipulate by the Office of Insurance Commission and Health Insurance of Thailand, must be completed, signed, and stamped by the insurance company. The form can be downloaded from https://longstay.tgia.org.
- 7. **Health Insurance issued by an insurer in Thailand**, with an outpatient benefit of no less than 40,000 THB and an inpatient benefit of no less than 400,000 THB
- 8. Certificate of criminal record clearance from the country of nationality. In case the applicants have permanent residence in another country, the aforementioned document is required from both the country of nationality and the country of permanent residence. The certificate must be valid for no more than 3 months.
